Robert Plane's charismatic and dynamic performances as soloist and chamber musician have brought wide critical acclaim. He is currently principal clarinet of the BBC National Orchestra of Wales.

David Pyatt (with whom the Goulds have recently recorded the Brahms Horn Trio) is one of Britain's finest horn players. He is principal horn of the LSO and was winner of the BBC Young Musician of the Year in 1987.

Benjamin Nabarro plays with the London Bridge Ensemble and the Olivier Ensemble. David Adams is leader of the Ulster Orchestra and artistic director of the Goldberg Ensemble.

James Boyd is a member of the London Haydn String Quartet, (and formerly of the Vellinger Quartet and Raphael Ensemble), and Kate Gould of the Leopold String Trio and London Bridge Ensemble. Louise Williams was formerly a member of the Chillingirian and Endellion Quartets.

Martin Neary, former organist of Winchester Cathedral and Westminster Abbey, once again directs the music at the Festival Service.
