Shortlisted in 2006 by the Royal Philharmonic Society as one of the three most outstanding chamber groups, The Gould Piano Trio continues to delight audiences throughout the world. Recent appearances include the Wigmore Hall, a return tour to the US and to the City of London Festival, where they were described in the Independent as "master musicians and dramatists". The Goulds are familiar to BBC Radio 3 listeners, and recent CD releases include works by Stanford on Naxos and Tchaikovsky on the Quartz label.

Robert Plane's charismatic and dynamic performances as soloist and chamber musician have brought wide critical acclaim. He is currently principal clarinet of the BBC National Orchestra of Wales.

David Adams is leader of the Ulster Orchestra and Artistic Director of the Goldberg Ensemble. James Boyd, formerly of the Vellinger Quartet and Raphael Ensemble, is now a member of the London Haydn String Quartet. Kate Gould plays with the Leopold String Trio, Olivier Ensemble and the Chamber Orchestra of Europe.

Graham Mitchell is a member of the Philharmonia, and much in demand as a chamber musician. Martin Neary, former organist of Winchester Cathedral and Westminster Abbey once again directs the Festival Service.
